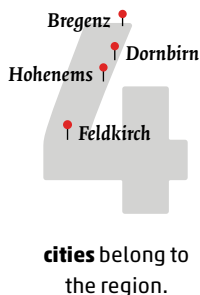

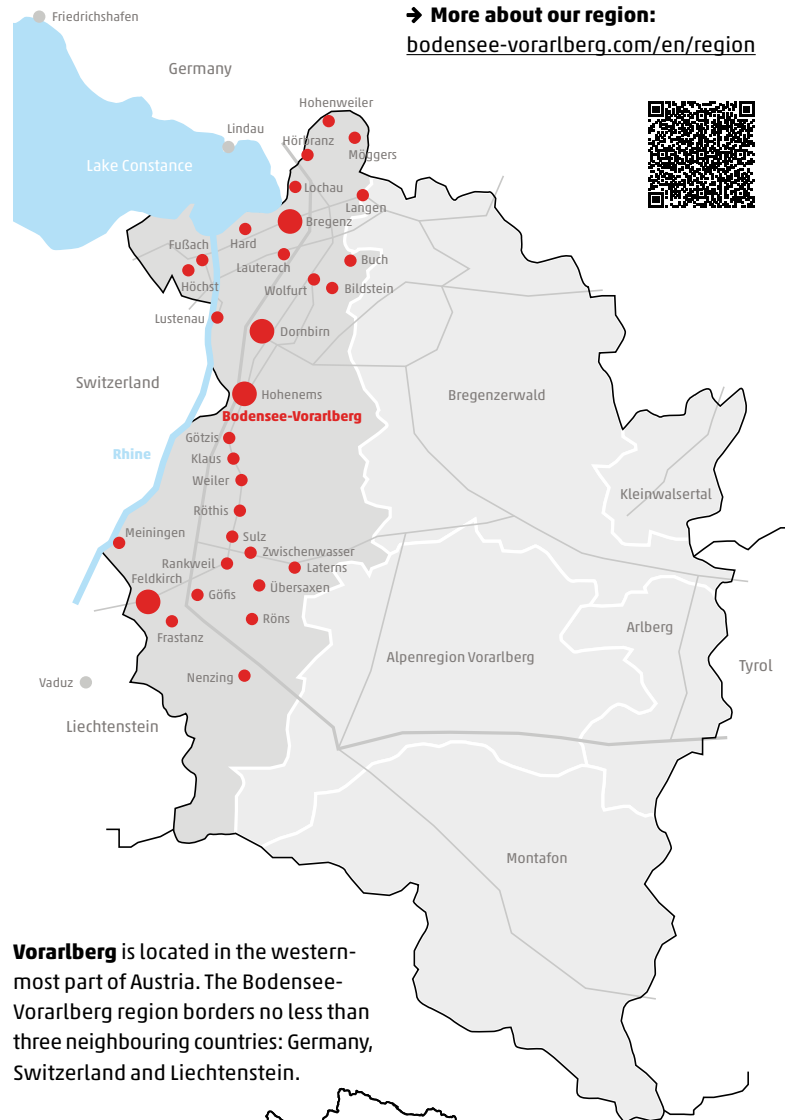

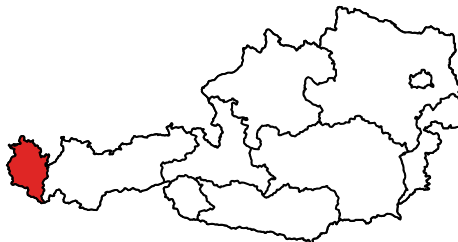

Vorarlberg is located in the westernmost part of Austria. The Bodensee-Vorarlberg region borders no less than three neighbouring countries: Germany, Switzerland and Liechtenstein.



Getting around

The Bodensee-Vorarlberg region is easily reachable by all modes of transport. The public transport system here is very well developed, serving as an excellent alternative to car transport.

With the Bodensee-Vorarlberg Leisure Card you can ride buses and trains for free throughout Vorarlberg and on cross-border trains to Lindau (Germany), St. Margrethen and Buchs (Switzerland), and Tirol's St. Anton am Arlberg.

By bus & train

By car

The use of all motorways and highways in Austria (in Vorarlberg, the A14 and S16) is subject to charge. Toll stickers are available to purchase for 1 day, 10 days, 2 months, or 1 year.

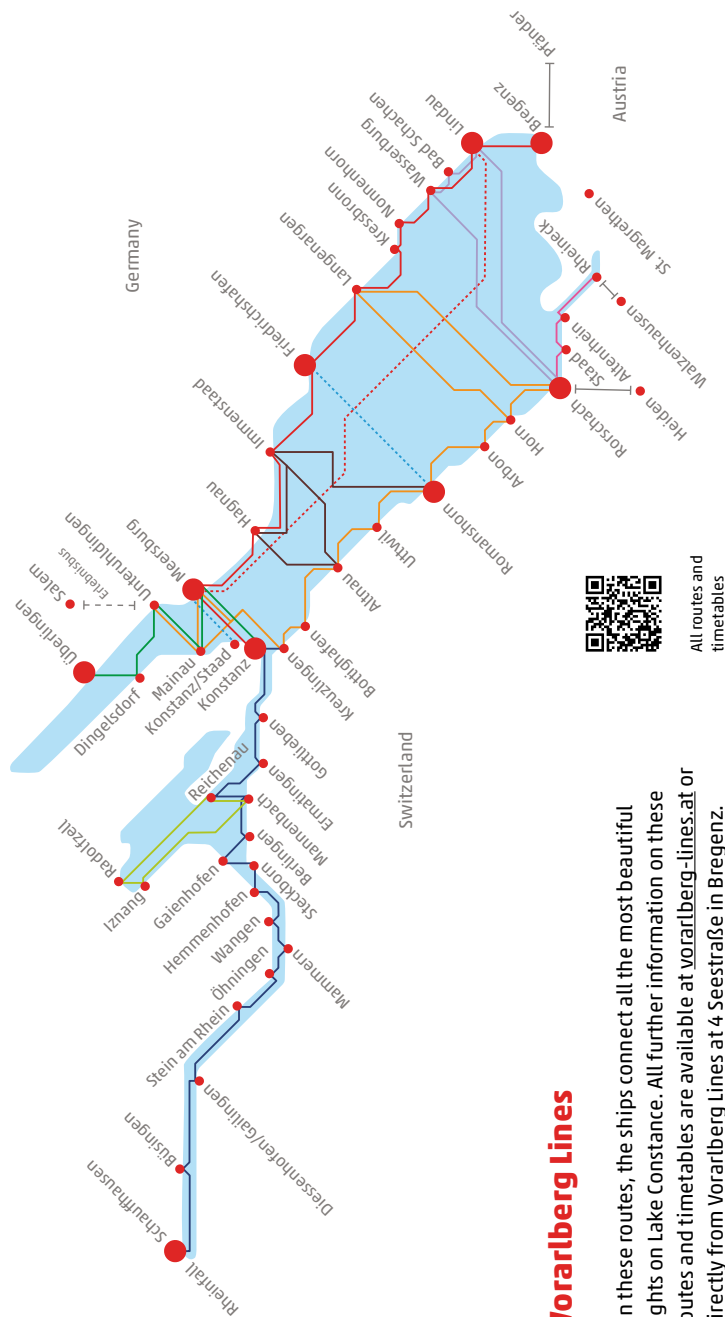
The motorway section Hörbranz and Hohenems (A14) is exempt from toll (as of December 2023).

Along with trains and buses, the Lake Constance ships of Vorarlberg Lines can be used both as modes of transport and a way to get to various destinations.

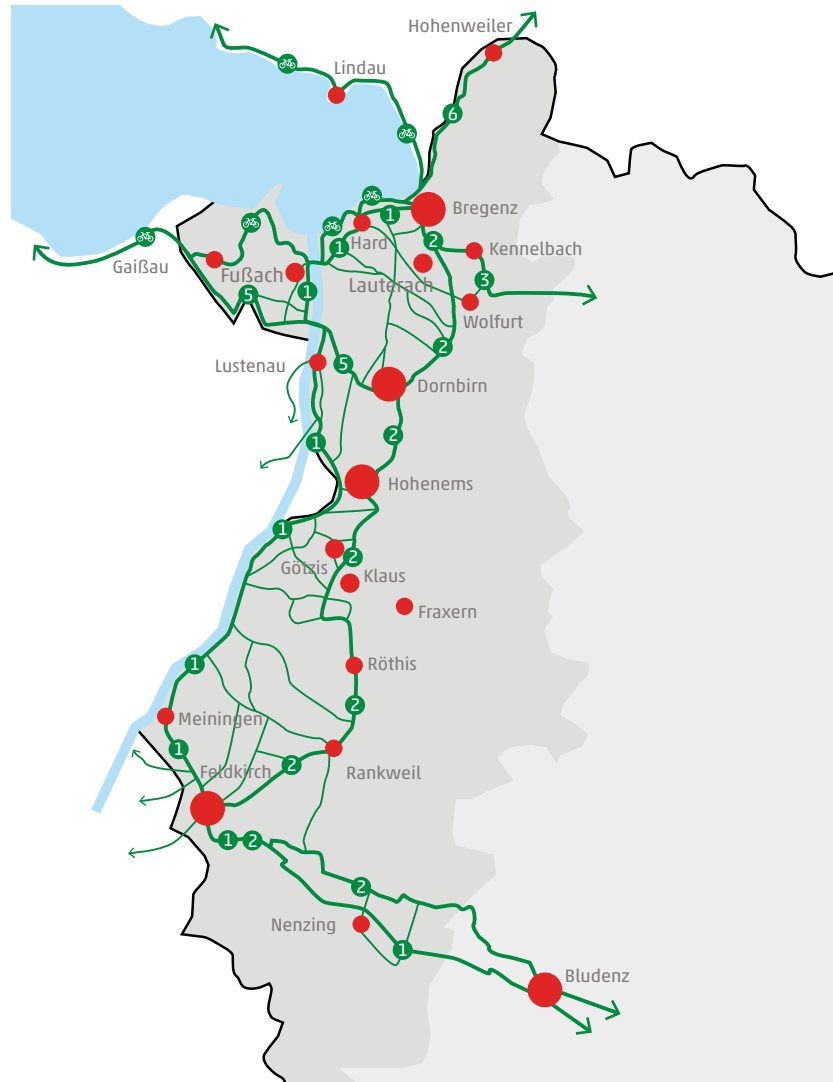

Travelling by bike opens up completely new perspectives and landscapes. The cycle paths here lead through unspoiled nature reserves, along the banks of the Rhine or Lake Constance and through forests and meadows. 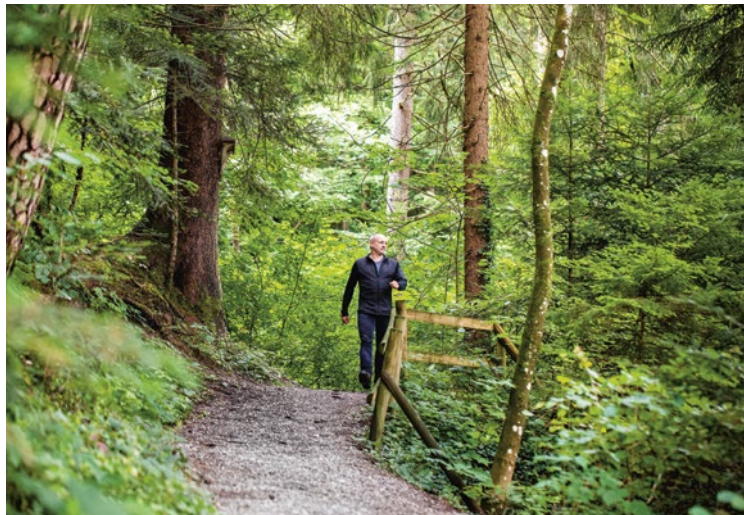

Forest bathing

The lifelong forester Jürgen-Thomas Ernst has spent many years delving deep into the secrets of our local forests. As an author, he teaches readers about the local plant life, and in his work as a forestry educator he imparts these secrets during exciting guided tours.

A forester is basically responsible for overseeing anything that happens in a forest. They're the ones who, for example, can quickly recognise when trees are showing signs of stress – a healthy tree protects itself effectively with resin against insect attacks. "You have to realize that trees are more evolved than humans," says Ernst. "They've survived all weather extremes and climatic changes over millions of years – they have abilities we're not even aware of."

As an author, Jürgen-Thomas Ernst has long made a name for himself by writing plays, novels, non-fiction, and even detective stories about forests. And since he's been working as a forestry educator, he's also busy giving children and adults tours through forests from Wolfurt to Gaißau that he used to oversee. Ernst loves sharing all that the forest has to tell us: "My book *Secrets of the Forest (Geheimnisse des Waldes)* is about which remedies grow in the forest, which plants are edible and which are not. I see a great need for this knowledge, because we can't protect what we can't see."

Raising awareness for trees and plants is important for our future, although as Ernst also believes, the forest "doesn't need any help from us, it's an extremely intelligent system, I would even say it's flawless." His perspectives on nature and its regenerative capacity are hopeful: "We owe our children and grandchildren an optimistic belief that we can turn things around," he says. Ernst contributes a great deal both with his books and with his educational work in the forest. His tours therefore come highly recommended, even if you sometimes need to wait – after all, forests move at a tree's pace.

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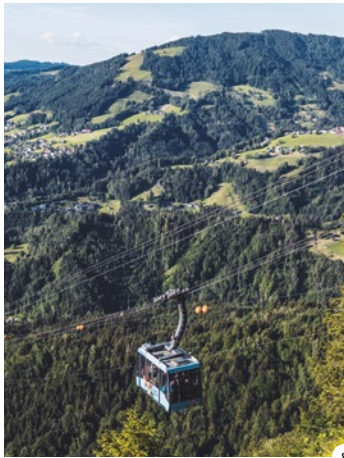

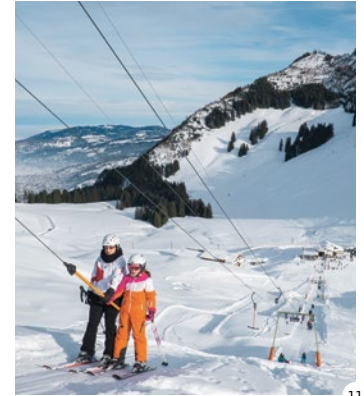

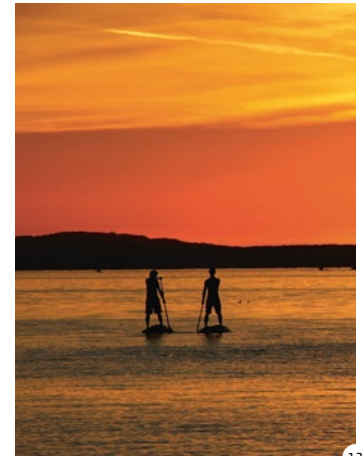

The stunning variety of the region's built environment opens doors to both the past and the future. Sitting on several thousand years of culture, numerous listed monuments here now engage in an exciting dialogue with newer buildings from some of modern architecture's biggest names. These are all accessible to visitors and many are home to either cultural or culinary highlights – immerse yourself in the region's aesthetic and cultural heritage by exploring some of our most beautiful buildings.

Food and Drink

Enjoying culinary delights is always one of the most sensual ways of exploring new places. The traditional food here is healthy, homely and down-to-earth, from fresh *Lake Constance fish* to a classic local veal *Schnitzel*. For an alpine region, fine cheese is also of great importance and can be found in a local *Lumpensalat* and of course the ever-present *Kässpätzle*. There's even a distinctive breakfast dish to try in the form of *Riebel*, a corn-based hearty variation on porridge.

Traditionally, the dishes are featured on many menus in the region. The list of good restaurants, cafes, bars, and ice cream parlors is so extensive that for simplicity's sake, you can find them all online.

Vorarlberger Kässpätzle with brown butter and fried onions

Ingredients for 4 people

500 g Vorarlberger Spätzle Mehl (flour)

7 Eggs

200 ml Ländle Milch (milk)

50 ml Mineral water

400 g Ländle Spätzlekäs

(cheese mixture or 190 g grated Vorarlberger Bergkäse, 160 g of 12-month matured Ländle Rädkäse, 50 g Ländle Rheintaler Käse)

50 g Ländle Sura Käs

60 g Ländle butter

Fried onions:

3 Onions

30 g Vorarlberger Mehl (flour)

20 g Paprika (sweet)

Instructions:

Heat the Ländle butter in a pan until it's brown and has a nutty aroma. Place the Vorarlberger Spätzlemehl (flour), salt, pepper and nutmeg in a bowl. Add the Ländle Milch (milk), mineral water and eggs and mix with a wooden spoon to form a firm dough. Beat the dough until it starts to bubble. Be sure to have a pan with plenty of boiling salted water ready. Press the dough through a Spätzler and bring to boil. Scoop the spaetzle into a bowl using a slotted spoon – you can leave a little of the spaetzle water behind to keep them moist. Sprinkle the grated cheese mixture on top and mix into the spaetzle with a wooden spoon until it starts to become stringy. Pour the brown butter on top.

Fried onions:

Cut the onions into fine rings using a slicer. Place in a bowl, dust with flour and paprika powder and mix well until the onions have absorbed everything. Fry in hot oil at 180 °C and drain on kitchen paper. Sprinkle the onions over the Kässpätzle.

#zäm: Cooperation and quality

Some catch fish, others tend to bees, while yet more tend to deer or pigs. The diversity of agricultural production here is astounding, also encompassing organic vegetables or those rescuing almost-disappeared grain types. What connects all these producers is an uncompromising commitment to quality and responsible production. **Michael Kühne from Lisilis Biohof** speaks for many of his peers when he says: *"We want to manage this piece of land in such a way that we can pass it on in an intact condition at some point."* In the region's farmers stores can be found an assortment of seasonal delights such as milk, yoghurt, cream cheeses, and fresh vegetables.

In addition to direct sales, cooperations with local businesses are hugely important for producers here. Quality is particularly appreciated in the restaurant trade, and trust is imperative for this. **Mario Fitzek from the Löwen guesthouse in Nofels**, for example, says: *"With the products that we use in the business, I want to regularly check for myself that the quality is right in all areas."* This would be difficult if you were buying wholesale, but is no issue if you personally know the suppliers.

This kind of cooperation is not limited to restaurants and producers; it extends to conceptualising new ideas and products. As an example of this, Vorarlberger Mehl and Sennhof in Rankweil collaborated in bringing back one of the oldest cultivated grain sorts back onto the market: Emmer ancient grain flour. The motivation for doing so says much about the respect of producers for their trade and tradition. As **Felix Rhomberg from Vorarlberger Mehl** notes, *"Emmer ancient grain flour is a 100 % Vorarlberg product. The added value remains 100 % in the region."*

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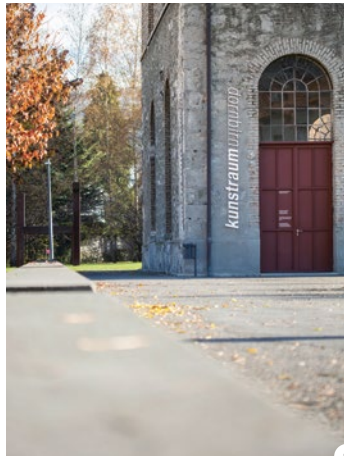

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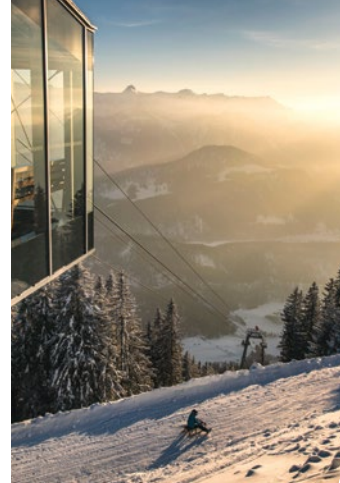
